A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Article XII, section 7 of the state
 constitution requires the State to "protect all rights,
- 3 customarily and traditionally exercised for subsistence,
- 4 cultural and religious purposes and possessed by ahupua'a tenants
- 5 who are descendants of native Hawaiians who inhabited the
- 6 Hawaiian Islands prior to 1778, subject to the right of the
- 7 State to regulate such rights."
- 8 Act 50, Session Laws of Hawaii 2000, amended chapter 343,
- 9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to require that environmental impact
- 10 statements assess the effects of a proposed action on the
- 11 cultural practices of the community and State. Act 50
- 12 specifically acknowledges the State's responsibility to protect
- 13 native Hawaiian cultural practices. Act 50 states in pertinent
- 14 part in section 1:
- 15 "The legislature also finds that native Hawaiian culture
- 16 plays a vital role in preserving and advancing the unique
- 17 quality of life and the "aloha spirit" in Hawaii. Articles IX
- and XII of the state constitution, other state laws, and the 2012-0533 SB SMA.doc

- 1 courts of the State impose on government agencies a duty to
- 2 promote and protect cultural beliefs, practices, and resources
- 3 of native Hawaiians as well as other ethnic groups.
- 4 Moreover, the past failure to require native Hawaiian
- 5 cultural impact assessments has resulted in the loss and
- 6 destruction of many important cultural resources and has
- 7 interfered with the exercise of native Hawaiian culture. The
- 8 legislature further finds that due consideration of the effects
- 9 of human activities on native Hawaiian culture and the exercise
- 10 thereof is necessary to ensure the continued existence,
- 11 development, and exercise of native Hawaiian culture."
- 12 More than ten years after the enactment of Act 50, the
- 13 legislature finds that the State's environmental impact
- 14 statement law still does not adequately protect constitutionally
- 15 protected native Hawaiian traditional and customary rights, due
- 16 in large part to the absence of language in Act 50 that provided
- 17 a mechanism for the consideration of cultural practices in the
- 18 environmental review process.
- 19 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that native Hawaiian
- 20 traditional and cultural rights are protected in the
- 21 environmental impact statement law.

SECTION 2. Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§343- Cultural impact assessment and cultural impact 5 **statement.** (a) All draft and final environmental assessments 6 shall include a cultural impact assessment. (b) All draft and final environmental impact statements 7 shall include a cultural impact statement." 8 SECTION 3. Section 343-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 10 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately 11 inserted and to read as follows: 12 ""Cultural impact assessment" means a written evaluation to 13 determine whether an action may have a significant effect on the 14 cultural sites and practices of the community and State, including the traditional and customary rights of native 15 16 Hawaiians protected pursuant to article XII, section 7, of the 17 Hawaii state constitution. "Cultural impact statement" means an informational document 18 19 that discloses the effects of a proposed action on the cultural 20 sites and practices of the community and State, including the

- 3 SECTION 4. Pursuant to section 343-6, Hawaii Revised
- 4 Statutes, the environmental council shall adopt rules for the
- 5 purposes of this Act no later than January 1, 2014.
- 6 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
