A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOILER AND ELEVATOR SAFETY LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 397, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§397- Boiler and elevator special fund; establishment;
5	purposes. (a) There is established in the state treasury the
6	boiler and elevator special fund, into which shall be deposited
7	all fees collected pursuant to section 397-5 and appropriations
8	from the legislature. All interest and investment moneys earned
9	on any moneys in the special fund shall become part of the
10	special fund.
11	(b) The purpose of the special fund is to provide for
12	sufficient operating costs to carry out the purposes of this
13	chapter. Moneys in the fund may be expended for:
14	(1) Personnel and operating expenses;
15	(2) Staff training and staff certification fees and
16	expenses;

1	(3)	Preparation and dissemination of public information on
2	,	safe installation and use of equipment regulated by
3		this chapter;
4	(4)	Preparation of annual reports to the legislature as
5		required by this chapter; and
6	<u>(5)</u>	Reimbursement to the general fund over a five-year
7		period to pay back the original start up
8		appropriation.
9	<u>(c)</u>	The director shall submit a report to the legislature
10	on the st	atus of the boiler and elevator special fund, including
11	expenditu	res and program results, not less than twenty days
12	prior to	the convening of each regular session."
13	SECT	ION 2. Section 397-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended t	o read as follows:
15	"§39	7-5 Fees. (a) The director may prescribe reasonable
16	fees to b	e charged for inspection, examination, other services
17	rendered	and for permits, certificates, or licenses, the
18	issuance	of which are required by this chapter or by any rule or
19	regulatio	n of the department promulgated pursuant to this
20	chapter,	and for:
21	(1)	[Inspection] Inspections by the department of any
22		boiler, pressure system, amusement ride, and elevator

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1		and kindred equipment for which a permit or
2		certificate is required for its installation,
3		operation or use and which is required to be inspected
4		by this chapter or by any rule or regulation of the
5		department; and
6	(2)	Examination of any person applying for permits,
7		certificates or licenses as required by this chapter
8		or by any rule or regulation of the department.
9 .	(b)	All fees received by the department pursuant to this
10	section s	hall be paid into the [general fund of the State.]
11	boiler an	d elevator special fund.
12	<u>(c)</u>	Effective July 1, 2012, the fees for inspections,
13	permits,	and examinations of boilers, pressure systems,
14	elevators	, and kindred equipment shall be as prescribed by the
15	schedules	in this section until the director adopts rules
16	pursuant	to chapter 91 to amend the fees specified in this
17	section.

17	amended b	y amending subsection (e) to read as follows:	
18	"(e)	Civil penalties owed under this chapter shall be	paid
19	to the de	partment and deposited into the general fund. Civ	<u>il</u>
20	penalties	owed under this chapter may be recovered in a civ	il
21	action in	the name of the department and the State brought	in
22	the distr	ict or circuit court for the circuit where the	
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- 1 violation is alleged to have occurred or where the owner, user,
- 2 contractor or vendor has the owner's, user's, contractor's, or
- 3 vendor's principal office."
- 4 SECTION 4. (a) The director may establish ten additional
- 5 positions, subject to chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes, to carry out the purposes of chapter 397, Hawaii
- 7 Revised Statutes. The positions may include a branch manager,
- 8 up to the equivalent of six full-time elevator inspectors, one
- 9 boiler inspector, and two office assistants.
- 10 (b) To enable the hiring and retention of quality
- 11 inspectors and supervisory personnel, the director shall have
- 12 the authority to set compensation, incentives, and other working
- 13 conditions that may differ from that administered by the
- 14 department of human resources development. The appropriate
- 15 collective bargaining unit shall be consulted prior to
- 16 implementing any changes to working conditions.
- 17 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for start-
- 20 up costs to be deposited to the credit of the boiler and
- 21 elevator special fund.

3	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the boiler and
4	elevator special fund the sum of \$2,900,000 or so much thereof
5	as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the department
6	of labor and industrial relations to carry out the purposes of
7	this Act, including the hiring of necessary staff.
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9	labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.
10	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.

Report Title:

Boiler and Elevator Safety; Boiler and Elevator Special Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes the boiler and elevator special fund to collect and deposit fees for inspections, permits, and examinations of boilers, pressure systems, elevators, and kindred equipment; provides for sufficient operating costs to carry out the purpose of the boiler and elevator safety law. Authorizes the director of labor and industrial relations to establish up to ten additional positions, including elevator and boiler inspectors. Appropriates funds for start up costs and hiring of necessary staff.
