A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PENSION AND RETIREMENT SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 88-321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$88-321 Election and membership. (a) Any member, except
- 4 for a member described in subsection (c), who is in service on
- 5 June 30, 2006, may elect to become a class H member effective
- 6 July 1, 2006, by filing an election form with the system in
- 7 accordance with this section. The election shall be made prior
- 8 to April 1, 2006, by members in service on February 28, 2006;
- 9 provided that any member in service on February 28, 2006, who is
- 10 absent from the State on that date while in the military service
- 11 of the United States, shall have thirty days after the member
- 12 returns to the member's regular employment with the State or a
- 13 county to make the election. The election shall be made by
- 14 members entering or returning to service from March 1, 2006,
- through June 30, 2006, within sixty days of entering or 15
- returning to service. The election shall be irrevocable [-], 16
- except as provided in subsection (d). 17
- 18 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary:



1	(1)	A class C member who returns to service after June 30,
2		2006, and who does not return to service as a class A
3		or a class B member shall become a class H member upon
4		return to service; provided that, if the member is a
5		former class A or class B member who received a refund
6		of contributions picked up and paid by the member's
7		employer pursuant to section 88-46(b), the member may
8		not become a class H member and shall return to
9		service as a class C member, unless the refund was
10		made pursuant to section 88-96 or 88-271(b);
11	(2)	A class A or a class B member, who returns to service
12		after June 30, 2006, but does not have vested benefit
13		status as provided in section 88-96(b) and who does
14		not return to service as a class A or class B member,
15		shall become a class H member upon return to service
16		and the member's credited service as a class A or B
17		member shall be converted to class C credited service.
18		The system shall return to the member the member's
19		accumulated contributions if the member's accumulated
20		contributions are \$1,000 or less at the time of
21		distribution. If the member's accumulated

1		that was converted to class C credited service are
2		greater than \$1,000 and the member does not make
3		written application, contemporaneously with the
4		member's return to service, for return of such
5		contributions, the member, except as provided by
6		section 88-341, may not withdraw the member's
7		accumulated contributions for the class A or B
8		credited service that was converted to class C
9		credited service until the member retires or attains
10		age sixty-two;
11	(3)	A class A member who returns to service after June 30,
12		2008, with vested benefit status and who does not
13		return to service as a class B member shall return to
14		service as a class A member; and
15	(4)	A class B member who returns to service after June 30,
16		2008, with vested benefit status and who does not
17		return to service as a class B member shall return to
18		service as a class A member.
19	(c)	The following members may not elect to become a class

21	(1)	Judges, elected officials, and legislative officers;

14		member's employer pursuant to section 88-46(b), unless
15		the refund was made pursuant to section 88-96 or 88-
16		271(b), including any class C member whose
17		contributions were refunded to the member pursuant to
18		section 88-46.5 in the form in which it existed at any
19		time prior to July 1, 2006.
20	(d)	Effective July 1, 2012, any member, except for a
21	member de	scribed in subsection (c), who:

Was in service on June 30, 2006;
