A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that athletic activity
- 2 promotes physical health, mental alertness, and encourages
- 3 involvement in school. The effort and time contributed by
- 4 school cheerleaders is substantially similar to that of other
- 5 students who participate in officially recognized
- 6 interscholastic sports. Due to its ongoing nature, cheerleading
- 7 often requires more time and activity than seasonal sports.
- 8 Cheerleading is primarily, although not exclusively, performed
- 9 by female students. The training, skills, and practice sessions
- 10 of cheerleaders are as demanding and active as sports that are
- 11 officially recognized, and require the same vigor, stamina,
- 12 flexibility, and strength. Classifying cheerleading as an
- 13 interscholastic sport would acknowledge the similarities of the
- 14 characteristics, abilities, and efforts that cheerleaders share
- 15 with participants in other school sports, and would provide more
- 16 opportunities for the dedicated students, who give their time
- 17 and efforts for the benefit of their schools as cheerleaders.

S.B. NO. **2393**

1 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force within 2 the department of education to assess the appropriateness, 3 feasibility, and impact of classifying cheerleading as an 4 interscholastic sport within the public education system, and if 5 deemed appropriate, recommend necessary legislation and create a 6 plan to implement cheerleading as an interscholastic sport for 7 the department of education. 8 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a task force on 9 cheerleading within the department of education. The task force 10 shall consist of the following members: 11 Three members who are cheerleading coaches, appointed (1)12 by the governor; 13 (2) Two members who represent public high school athletic 14 departments, appointed by the superintendent of 15 education; 16 (3) One member appointed by the president of the senate; 17 and 18 (4)One member appointed by the speaker of the house of 19 representatives; 20 (b) The members of the task force shall not receive

compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for

- 1 necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred during
- 2 the performance of their duties under this Act.
- 3 (c) The task force shall assess the appropriateness,
- 4 feasibility, and impact of classifying cheerleading as an
- 5 interscholastic sport in public school athletic programs,
- 6 including any insurance and budgetary requirements.
- 7 If cheerleading as an interscholastic sport is deemed
- 8 appropriate, the task force shall create an implementation plan
- 9 for the department of education for the inclusion of
- 10 cheerleading as an interscholastic sport.
- 11 (d) The task force shall submit a final report of its
- 12 finding and recommendations to the legislature no later than
- 13 July 1, 2013.
- 14 (e) The department of education shall provide the research
- 15 and organizational support services necessary to assist the task
- 16 force in achieving its purposes as required under this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 18 and shall be repealed as of July 1, 2013.
