A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 436B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"§436B- Licensure by endorsement or licensure by		
5	reciprocity; experience requirements. (a) Unless otherwise		
6	provided by law, an applicant for licensure by endorsement or		
7	licensure by reciprocity who is a nonresident military spouse		
8	may demonstrate competency in a specific profession or vocation		
9	as determined by the licensing authority in lieu of a		
10	requirement that the applicant has worked or practiced in that		
11	profession or vocation for a specified period of time prior to		
12	the application for licensure by endorsement or licensure by		
13	reciprocity.		
14	(b) The licensing authority shall expedite consideration		
15	of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement or		
16	license by reciprocity to a nonresident military spouse who		
17	meets the requirements of this section.

12		stating that application information, including
13		necessary prior employment history, is true and
14		accurate. Upon receiving the affidavit, the licensing
15		authority shall issue the license to the nonresident
16		military spouse and may revoke the license at any time
17		if the information provided in the application is
18		found to be false.
19	(b)	The licensing authority shall issue to the nonresident
20	military s	spouse a temporary license to allow the nonresident
21	military s	spouse to perform specified services, under the
22	supervisio	on of a professional licensed by this State if
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- 1 appropriate, while completing any requirements necessary for
- 2 licensure in this State; provided that a temporary license shall
- 3 only be issued in those professions where credentials,
- 4 experience, or passage of a national exam is substantially
- 5 equivalent to or exceed those established by the licensing
- 6 authority of this State.
- 7 (c) The licensing authority shall expedite consideration
- 8 of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement,
- 9 license by reciprocity, or temporary license to a nonresident
- 10 military spouse who meets the requirements of this section."

- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Licensing; Licensure by Endorsement; Licensure by Reciprocity; Nonresident Military Spouses

Description:

Permits licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity in certain situations for a nonresident military spouse. Establishes procedures for a nonresident military spouse to receive a license by endorsement or license by reciprocity. Permits issuance of a temporary license if certain requirements are met. Requires the licensing authority to expedite consideration of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement, license by reciprocity, or temporary license to a qualified nonresident military spouse.
