A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that thousands of Hawaii
- 2 residents experience disabilities such as visual impairments,
- 3 dyslexia, and physical impairments that prevent them from
- 4 directly accessing conventional print media. Many printed
- 5 materials are available through governmental and nonprofit
- 6 agencies in accessible formats such as braille, large print, or
- 7 audio recording. However, the legislature finds that it is
- 8 generally not practical to provide time-sensitive information
- 9 such as a local daily newspaper in these specialized formats.
- 10 The legislature also finds that even in a media environment
- 11 where information is frequently available in multiple formats
- 12 that are portable and widely accessible, telephone-based audible
- 13 information access remains an important service for many
- 14 individuals.
- The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to maintain
- 16 a telephone-based audible information access service.
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$80,000 or so much

- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 to
- 2 maintain a telephone-based audible information access service.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the vocational
- 4 rehabilitation and services for the blind division of the
- 5 department of human services for the purposes of this Act;
- 6 provided that the appropriation authorized under this Act shall
- 7 be expended on a contract for services with the Hawaii affiliate
- **8** of a national organization that:
- 9 (1) Has affiliates in all fifty states; and
- 10 (2) Provides electronic services that enables blind,
- 11 visually-impaired, or print-disabled persons to access
- newspapers, magazines, and television listings twenty-
- four hours a day, seven days a week, by means of a
- 14 touch-tone telephone, the Internet, or by downloading
- the electronic information to a digital talking book
- player or MP3 playing device.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
