A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "<u>\$201-</u> Hawaii 3Ts school technology laboratories fund.
- 5 (a) There is established the Hawaii 3Ts school technology
- 6 laboratories fund (hereinafter "fund") as a separate fund of the
- 7 Economic Development Alliance of Hawaii, Inc., a Hawaii
- 8 nonprofit organization. Moneys received from the state, county,
- 9 or federal government, private contributions of cash or other
- 10 property, and the income and capital gains earned by the fund
- 11 shall constitute its assets.
- 12 (b) The Economic Development Alliance of Hawaii, Inc.,
- 13 shall expend moneys in the form of either grants to
- 14 organizations or contracts with private vendors from the fund
- 15 for the establishment and maintenance of technology laboratories
- 16 in public schools in Hawaii. Expenditures shall be in
- 17 accordance with this section, and consistent with the criteria

1 and recommendations of the Hawaii 3Ts school technology 2 laboratories board. 3 (c) The fund may receive contributions, grants, 4 endowments, or gifts in cash or otherwise from all sources, 5 including corporations or other businesses, foundations, 6 government, individuals, and other interested parties. The 7 legislature intends that the public and private sectors work 8 together as partners in securing contributions for the fund, and 9 that the Economic Development Alliance of Hawaii, Inc., through 10 its Hawaii 3Ts project, assist the public and private sectors in 11 reviewing and investigating all potential funding sources. The 12 State may appropriate moneys to the fund; provided that any 13 appropriations made by the State are not intended to supplant 14 the funding of any existing public school programs for the 15 establishment and maintenance of school technology laboratories. 16 The Economic Development Alliance of Hawaii, Inc., shall appoint the members of the Hawaii 3Ts school technology 17 18 laboratories board, which shall be responsible for: 19 Soliciting and otherwise raising moneys for the fund; (1) 20 Establishing criteria for proposals to be funded and (2)

Places the Hawaii 3Ts school technology laboratories fund under the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. Repeals section 302A-1314, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Requires the University of Hawaii to extend the current land lease with the high technology development corporation for no less than twenty-five years from the date of expiration of the existing lease. Effective July 1, 2112. (SB2528 HD1)
