A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. This Act is intended to encourage proper

2 nutrition for those who receive coupons under the federal

3 supplemental nutrition assistance program. This Act is

4 consistent with the Congressional Declaration of Policy under

Food Stamp Act of 1977 (7 United States Code, section 2011),

"It is declared to be the policy of Congress, in order to promote the general welfare, to safeguard the health and well-being of the Nation's population by raising levels of nutrition among low-income households. Congress finds that the limited food purchasing power of low-income households contributes to hunger and malnutrition among members of such households. Congress further finds that increased utilization of food in establishing and maintaining adequate national levels of nutrition will promote the distribution in a beneficial manner of the Nation's agricultural abundance and will strengthen the Nation's agricultural economy, as well as result in more orderly

1	marketing and distribution of foods. To alleviate such		
2	hunger and malnutrition, a supplemental nutrition		
3	assistance program is herein authorized which will permit		
4	low-income households to obtain a more nutritious diet		
5	through normal channels of trade by increasing food		
6	purchasing power for all eligible households who apply for		
7	participation."		
8	The purpose of this Act is to allow the use of food coupons		
9	under the federal supplemental nutrition assistance program to		
10	purchase hot meals from lunch counters, lunch wagons, and food		
11	vending trucks and fresh staple foods from farmers markets.		
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
14	and to read as follows:		
15	"§346- Supplemental nutrition assistance program; hot		
16	foods; fresh foods. In addition to the eligible foods under the		
17	federal supplemental nutrition assistance program, a coupon		
18	issued under the supplemental nutrition assistance program may		
19	be used to purchase:		
20	(1) Hot meals served as lunch counter items or foods to be		
21	eaten in the store, including lunch wagon or food		
22	vending trucks; and

1	(2)	Staple foods sold at farmer's markets or open markets
2		that are used for home preparation and consumption;
3		provided that the staple foods shall be limited to
4		fresh foods and cereals, including meat, poultry,
5		fish, bread, vegetables, fruits, and dairy products,
6		coffee, tea, cocoa, carbonated and noncarbonated
7		drinks, candy, condiments, and spices.
8	For purpo	ses of this section:
9	"Cou	pon" means any coupon, stamp, or type of certificate
10	printed b	y the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States
11	Departmen	t of Agriculture and issued by the department to
12	eligible	households for the purchase of eligible foods.
13	"Eli	gible foods" means:
14	(1)	Any food or food product intended for human
15		consumption, except alcoholic beverages and tobacco;
16	(2)	Seeds and plants to grow foods for the personal
17		consumption of eligible households;
18	(3)	Meals prepared and delivered by an authorized meal
19		delivery service to households eligible to use coupons
20		to purchase delivered meals, also known as meals on
21		wheels;

1	(4)	Meals served to households that are eligible to use
2		coupons for communal dining in a facility for the
3		elderly or supplemental security income households;
4	(5)	Meals prepared and served by an authorized drug
5		addiction or alcoholic treatment and rehabilitation
6		center to households eligible to use coupons to
7		<pre>purchase those meals;</pre>
8	<u>(6)</u>	Meals prepared by and served by an authorized group
9		living arrangement facility to a resident who is a
10		disabled member pursuant to section 17-663-1, Hawaii
11		Administrative Rules;
12	(7)	Meals prepared by and served by a shelter for battered
13		women and children to its eligible residents; and
14	(8)	In the case of homeless food stamp households, meals
15		prepared for and served by an authorized public or
16		private nonprofit establishment, approved by the state
17		program development - income maintenance office, that
18		feeds homeless persons.
19	"Fre	sh foods" means food that is not preserved by canning
20	or dehydra	ation or freezing or smoking."
21	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
