## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EARLY INTERVENTION COORDINATING COUNCIL.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 321-353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§321-353 Hawaii early intervention coordinating council;
4	establishment. (a) There is established within the department
5	for administrative purposes the Hawaii early intervention
6	coordinating council. Members shall be appointed for three-year
7	terms by the governor without the necessity of the advice and
8	consent of the senate. The [membership of the] council shall
9	[consist of fifteen] comprise twenty-three members [selected
10	from the following: as follows:
11	(1) At least [three] twenty per cent of the members shall
12	be parents of infants[-] or toddlers[-] with special
13	needs, or children [under the age of seven] with
14	special needs[+] aged twelve years or younger, with
15	knowledge of, or experience with, programs for infants
16	and toddlers with special needs, of which at least one
17	parent shall be a parent of an infant or toddler with

1		special needs, or of a child with special needs aged
2		six years or younger;
3	(2)	At least [three] twenty per cent of the members shall
4		be public or private providers of early intervention
5		services;
6	(3)	[At least one representative] Two members shall be
7		from the legislature[+], of which one member shall be
8		appointed by the president of the senate and one
9		member shall be appointed by the speaker of the house
10		of representatives;
11	(4)	[At least one person] One member shall be involved in
12		personnel preparation;
13	<u>(5)</u>	One member shall be from the department of health
14		program involved in the provision of, or payment for,
15		early intervention services to infants and toddlers
16		with special needs and their families who has
17		sufficient authority to engage in policy planning and
18		implementation on behalf of the program;
19	(6)	One member shall be from the department of health
20		program responsible for children's mental health;
21	[ <del>(5)</del>	At least one] (7) One member [representing] shall be
22		from the department of education[+] program

1		responsible for preschool services to children with
2		disabilities who has sufficient authority to engage in
3		policy planning and implementation on behalf of the
4		program;
5	(8)	One member shall be from the department of education
6		program responsible for the coordination of education
7		of homeless children and youths;
8	[ <del>(6)</del>	At least one] (9) One member [representing] shall be
9		from the department of human services[+] program
10		responsible for the state medicaid program;
11	(10)	One member shall be from the department of human
12		services program responsible for child care;
13	(11)	One member shall be from the department of human
14		services program responsible for foster care;
15	(12)	One member shall be from the department of commerce
16		and consumer affairs program responsible for the state
17	·	regulation of health insurance;
18	(13)	One member shall be from a Head Start or Early Head
19		Start agency or program in the state;
20	[ <del>(7)</del>	At least one member representing the office of the
21		governor;] and

1	[ <del>(8)</del> ] <u>(14)</u> Other members [ <del>representing private or public</del>
2	agencies] involved in or interested in [the payment
3	for or provision of services to infants and toddlers
4	with special needs and their families[ $\div$ ] who are
5	selected by the governor.
6	Any vacancy on the council shall be filled in the same
7	manner in which the original position was filled.
8	(b) The council shall elect its officers, and [eight]
9	twelve members shall constitute a quorum. Members shall serve
10	without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
11	including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
12	their duties. No member shall cast a vote on any matter that is
13	likely to provide a direct financial benefit to that member or
14	otherwise give the appearance of a conflict of interest. No
15	member from an executive or administrative department under
16	chapter 26 may serve as the chairperson of the council.
17	(c) The council shall meet at least quarterly and in such
18	places as it deems necessary. The meetings shall be publicly
19	announced, and be open and accessible to the general public.
20	(d) The council shall perform the following functions:
21	(1) Advise and assist the director in the identification
22	of the sources of fiscal and other support for

1		services for early intervention programs, assignment
2		of financial responsibility to the appropriate agency,
3		and the promotion of the interagency agreements;
4	(2)	Advise and assist the department in the preparation of
5		applications and amendments thereto; [and]
6	(3)	Advise and assist the department of education
7		regarding the transition of toddlers with special
8		needs to preschool and other appropriate services; and
9	[ <del>-(3)</del> ]	(4) Prepare and submit an annual report to the
10		governor on the status of early intervention programs
11		for infants and toddlers with special needs and their
12		families within the State."

15	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
