A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 708-893, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:

3 "(1) A person commits the offense of use of a computer in
4 the commission of a separate crime if the person:

5 (a) Intentionally uses a computer to obtain control over
6 the property of the victim to commit theft in the
7 first ~~[æ]~~, second, third, or fourth degree; or

8 (b) Knowingly uses a computer to identify, select,
9 solicit, persuade, coerce, entice, induce, or procure
10 the victim or intended victim of the following
11 offenses:

12 (i) Section 707-726, relating to custodial
13 interference in the first degree;

14 (ii) Section 707-727, relating to custodial
15 interference in the second degree;

16 (iii) Section 707-731, relating to sexual assault in
17 the second degree;


- 1 (iv) Section 707-732, relating to sexual assault in
- 2 the third degree;
- 3 (v) Section 707-733, relating to sexual assault in
- 4 the fourth degree;
- 5 (vi) Section 707-751, relating to promoting child
- 6 abuse in the second degree; or
- 7 (vii) Section 712-1215, relating to promoting
- 8 pornography for minors."

9 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11 begun before its effective date.

12 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
