
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ALOHA STADIUM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The department of accounting and general
2 services shall contract with an independent third party to
3 develop a long-range plan for Aloha Stadium, which shall include
4 a feasibility study to determine the cost benefits of placing
5 Aloha Stadium under the jurisdiction of the University of Hawaii
6 rather than the department of accounting and general services.
7 As part of the long range plan, the study shall focus on the
8 feasibility and cost benefits of giving the University of Hawaii
9 responsibility over the operation, maintenance, promotion, and
10 management of the premises and facilities at Aloha Stadium.

11 (b) The department of accounting and general services
12 shall report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
13 to the convening of the regular session of 2013 on the long-
14 range plan for Aloha Stadium, including the findings and
15 recommendations of the feasibility study conducted pursuant to
16 subsection (a).

17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the stadium
18 special fund the sum of \$50,000 or so much thereof as may be



1 necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the department of
2 accounting and general services to contract with an independent
3 third party to develop a long-range plan for Aloha Stadium,
4 which shall include a feasibility study to determine the cost
5 benefits of placing Aloha Stadium under the jurisdiction of the
6 University of Hawaii rather than the department of accounting
7 and general services.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
