# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STADIUM AUTHORITY.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 109-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:  
3           "(a) There shall be within the department of accounting  
4 and general services for administrative purposes only, a stadium  
5 authority whose responsibility shall be to maintain, operate,  
6 and manage the stadium and facilities attached thereto and to  
7 provide for the maintenance, operation, management, and  
8 promotion of the Kapolei recreational sports complex. The  
9 authority shall consist of [~~nine~~] eleven members, [~~who~~] nine of  
10 whom shall be appointed by the governor in the manner prescribed  
11 by section 26-34. Each appointed member of the authority shall  
12 have been a citizen of the United States and a resident of the  
13 State for at least five years [~~next~~] preceding the member's  
14 appointment. The president of the University of Hawaii, or the  
15 president's designee, shall be an ex officio member of the  
16 authority and shall have the power to vote on matters before the  
17 authority. The [~~president of the University of Hawaii and the~~]



1 superintendent of education shall be an ex officio [~~members~~  
2 member of the authority but shall not vote."

3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
