

1 be able to prevent or reduce chronic illness. Integrating
2 nutrition, exercise, and medical best practices not currently
3 covered by health insurance can be used to achieve significant
4 and positive results for patient health. Education, counseling,
5 and other best practices not currently covered by health
6 insurance can be used to reduce childhood obesity. The
7 legislature finds that childhood obesity has increased
8 significantly in Hawaii and across the nation, and must be
9 addressed in a significant way in order to avoid an epidemic of
10 early onset diabetes and other chronic diseases. Finally,
11 complementary and alternative medicine and healing can be used
12 to promote good health and wellness.

13 The legislature also finds that during the last legislative
14 session, QUEST faced an extensive budgetary shortfall.
15 Fortunately, the legislature was able to pass an emergency
16 appropriation measure so that contracted QUEST plans would
17 continue to receive payment in a timely manner. The legislature
18 believes it would be prudent to establish a legislative task
19 force to examine issues relating to medicaid shortfalls, and to
20 work toward a goal of preventing future shortfalls in the
21 program.

22 The purpose of this Act is to:



- 1 (1) Establish a wellness pilot program within medicaid;

- 3 (2) Establish a joint legislative task force on medicaid.

PART II

5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and
 8 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
 9 year 2012-2013 for the creation of a wellness pilot program for
 10 medicaid recipients or QUEST members.

11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
 12 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

PART III

14 SECTION 3. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
 15 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
 16 as follows:

"CHAPTER

JOINT LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON MEDICAID

19 § -1 Joint legislative task force on medicaid; authority
 20 to establish. (a) The president of the senate and the speaker
 21 of the house of representatives may, from time to time, convene
 22 a joint legislative task force on medicaid to examine issues



1 relating to medicaid shortfalls, including the medicaid buy-in
2 program for working people with disabilities.

3 (b) The chairs of the committee on human services of the
4 respective houses of the legislature shall co-chair the task
5 force.

6 (c) The task force shall consist of the following:

7 (1) Representatives from the committees on human services
8 of the respective houses of the legislature;

9 (2) The director of human services, or the director's
10 designee;

11 (3) The director of health, or the director's designee;

12 (4) The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the
13 director's designee;

14 (5) A representative from Hawaii Medical Service
15 Association;

16 (6) A representative from Kaiser Permanente;

17 (7) A representative from AlohaCare;

18 (8) A representative from Ohana Health Plan;

19 (9) A representative from Evercare;

20 (10) A representative from the Hawaii Primary Care
21 Association;



- 1 (11) A representative from the Healthcare Association of
- 2 Hawaii;
- 3 (12) A representative from the Hawaii Medical Association;
- 4 (13) A representative from Kalihi-Palama Health Center;
- 5 (14) A representative from Hawaii Medical Center;
- 6 (15) A representative from Mental Health America of Hawaii;
- 7 (16) A representative from Avalon Health Care Group;
- 8 (17) A representative from the Hawaii Dialectic
- 9 Association;

19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

20 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
