
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF THE COMPREHENSIVE
INFORMATION SYSTEM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ACT 54, SESSION
LAWS OF HAWAII 2011, TO FURTHER INCLUDE PUBLIC FACILITIES,
THEREBY CREATING A COMPREHENSIVE ASSET MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
FOR PUBLIC LANDS AND PUBLIC FACILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, Act 54, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, establishes a
2 comprehensive information system for public lands to be used for
3 the inventory and maintenance of information relating to the
4 public land trust, also known as ceded lands, and other state
5 lands; and

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7 WHEREAS, the land inventory required to be taken and
8 information to be maintained will be important tools to assist
9 the State to manage its public lands; and

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11 WHEREAS, all state and county agencies are directed to
12 assist the Department of Land and Natural Resources
13 ("Department") in facilitating the establishment of the
14 comprehensive information system for public lands; and

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16 WHEREAS, the Department shall also determine what other
17 information would be useful to include in the inventory; and

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19 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services
20 is responsible for managing and supervising a wide range of
21 state programs and activities including:

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23 (1) Maintenance and repair of state buildings and
24 facilities through its Central Services Division; and

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26 (2) Comprehensively managing the information processing
27 and telecommunication systems in order to provide
28 services to all state agencies through its Information
29 and Communication Services Division; and

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1 WHEREAS, insufficient information on underutilized land and
2 public facilities is exacerbating a loss of revenues because
3 inventories and necessary data required are not centralized and
4 accessible to all decision makers in order to make sound
5 economic decisions; and
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7 WHEREAS, a comprehensive information system that is a
8 centralized database which can be accessed by all State and
9 County authorized users to ensure accurate and consistent
10 utilization of State lands and public facilities in the best
11 economically responsible manner is necessary; and
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13 WHEREAS, given the dire economic situation of the State, it
14 is important that all state and county agencies work together to
15 ensure that our lands and facilities are being used to its
16 fullest potential; now, therefore,
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18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth
19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012, the
20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
21 and Natural Resources is urged to expand the scope of the
22 comprehensive information system established pursuant to Act 54,
23 Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, to inventory and maintain
24 information about the lands of the public land trust described
25 in section 5(f) of the Admission Act and article XII, section 4,
26 of the Hawaii State Constitution to further include public
27 facilities, thereby creating a comprehensive asset management
28 system for public lands and facilities; and
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30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department utilize the
31 resources of the Department of Accounting and General Services
32 to coordinate and develop the comprehensive asset management
33 system; and
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35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
36 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
37 Board of Land and Natural Resources and State Comptroller.
