Provides an option on tax returns and motor vehicle registration applications for a donation to the Foundation on Culture and the Arts. Establishes a Foundation on Culture and the Arts Donation Special Fund.	CUA, TRN, FIN
<u>HB 1983</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE COLLECTION OF DEMOGRAPHIC DATA BY STATE AGENCIES, BOARDS, AND COMMISSIONS. Requires state agencies to disaggregate data consistent with federal standards and requires publication of the data.	CUA, FIN
<u>HB 2062</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MUSIC THERAPY. Establishes the music therapy board within the department of commerce and consumer affairs. Requires licensure in order to use the title of "music therapist" or practice music therapy in the State.	CUA, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 2435</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS. Administratively places the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism instead of the Department of Accounting and General Services. <u>HB 2407</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ARTS. Appropriates funds for high-quality, integrated, meaningful arts education for students from kindergarten through grade 12.	CUA, EDN, FIN


