RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC PROCUREMENT CODE.

Amends section 103D-707, HRS, to permit an additional post-award remedy if the contract is not fully executed. Allows for rescission of the award and application of remedies provided for in section 103D-

706, HRS.

Establishes a process by which licensed or certified, unbiased real estate appraisers are used for arbitration proceedings to determine the

fair market value, fair market rental, or fair and reasonable rent of real property. Requires the DCCA to provide a list of appraisers meeting

HB 1840 RELATING TO STATE-OWNED BANK. ERB, CPC, FIN Status Establishes a task force to review, investigate, and study the feasibility and cost of establishing a state-owned bank. Requires a report to the Legislature. HB 1845 RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. **ERB** Status Short form bill. HB 1894 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. ERB, FIN Status Temporarily authorizes the governor or a county mayor to exempt a construction or design-build procurement from protest concerning the procurement and administrative review of a nonresponsible offeror determination. Requires, as a condition of the exemption, that all bids and proposals, including amendments or revisions, evaluations, and ratings be released for public inspection. Requires the posting of the information on the state or county website. HB 1925 RELATING TO LIQUOR. ERB, CPC Status Allows holders of Class 1 manufacturer liquor licenses to sell specified liquor manufactured from fruits or other products grown in the State to any person for private use and consumption. HB 1969 RELATING TO CONTRACTS. ERB, CPC/JUD Status Shortens the time by which subcontractors are to receive progress and final payments from contractors on government and private construction projects. Provides interest penalties for late payments. <u>HB 2013</u> RELATED TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS. ERB, CPC Amends the definition of mixed martial arts to include the regulation Status of other disciplines that use striking.
