Makes permanent the exclusion of pest control operators' activities from the definition of "excavation". Effective January 1, 3000.

Establishes veterinary license renewal requirement of twenty

HB 2162, HD1 (HSCR627-12) **Status** 

RELATING TO UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE ARTICLE 9. Implements the amendments to Article 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code, relating to secured transactions, set forth by the Uniform Law

HB 2359, HD1 (HSCR624-12) Status

RELATING TO PORTABLE ELECTRONICS INSURANCE. Establishes provisions for the sale of portable electronics insurance.

Requires vendors to hold a limited lines license to sell or offer

coverage under a policy. Effective January 1, 3000.

HB 2498, HD1 (HSCR558-12) Status

RELATING TO ESCROW DEPOSITORIES.

Amends the fee structure for services provided by the Division of Financial Institutions of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs for escrow depository regulation; amends fines for violations of escrow depository regulations; and adjusts bond requirements for

escrow depositories. Effective January 1, 3000.

HB 2499, HD1 (HSCR396-12) Status RELATING TO FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS.

CPC. FIN

Adjusts regulatory fees for financial institutions to more accurately

reflect today's economy. Effective July 1, 3000.

HB 2500, HD1 (HSCR397-12) Status RELATING TO MONEY TRANSMITTERS.

CPC, FIN

Authorizes the Commissioner of Financial Institutions to require money transmitters to register with the Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System; amends the fee structure for services provided by the Division of Financial Institutions for the regulation of money transmitters; amends the fine for violations of money transmitter regulations. Prohibits the Commissioner from establishing or adjusting fees by rule. Effective July 1, 3000.
