Limits DLNR fees for its comprehensive historic preservation program to amounts sufficient to cover the annual operating costs of the program, taking into account all other sources of program income. <u>HB 2883. HD1</u> <u>(HSCR392-12)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MAKAHA VALLEY. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to conduct a flood study on Makaha Valley. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2012.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 2819. HD1</u> <u>(HSCR390-12)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. Requires the HCDA to determine the costs and benefits of selling and purchasing certain properties within the Kakaako community development district. Requires the report to be submitted to the legislature 90 days after the Act's effective date. Effective July 1, 2020.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 2482</u> <u>(HSCR68-12)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. Extends the Hawaii Community Development Authority's authority to sell or lease all or a portion of the real or personal property constituting a redevelopment project to all projects.	WLO, FIN


