<u>HB 2248</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS FOR HAWAII PACIFIC UNIVERSITY. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to Hawaii Pacific University.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2053</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Exempts illegal immigrant students at the UH and community colleges from paying nonresident tuition under certain conditions; allows those students to receive scholarships from nonstate funds and participate in financial aid programs. Requires the board of regents to adopt rules. Limits relief allowed if a court finds any applicable statute unlawful.	HED, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1674</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Extends eligibility for state financial aid and resident tuition to students of the University of Hawaii without lawful immigration status who meet certain specified criteria.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 31</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Increases to \$5,000,000 the cap on the amount of expenditures that the UH Board of Regents can authorize from the UH Tuition and Fees Special Fund for the promotion of alumni relations and generation of private donations for deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2321</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS. Imposes a one year residency requirement on any at-large member of the UH board of regents.	HED, JUD



<u>HB 2633</u> <u>Status</u>	AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII MANOA CAMPUS CENTER COMPLEX. Authorizes the issuance of GO bonds and appropriates the revenues to the UH for the renovation and expansion of the UH campus center complex.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2813</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, AND INNOVATION AGENCY. Establishes the Hawaii Science, Technology, and Innovation Agency through a collaboration between UH Hilo and Hawaii Community College.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1997</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION. Short form bill.	HED

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
