<u>HB 1736</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE. Specifies that the Hawaii health connector shall establish separate risk pools for the individual market and the small group market. Establishes staggered terms for board members. Clarifies qualifications of and restrictions on navigators. Clarifies role of DHS in determining medicaid eligibility. Effective 7/1/12.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 2273</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONCUSSIONS. Requires the DOE and the Hawaii High School Athletic Association to develop a concussion awareness program to provide guidelines for public and private schools.	HLT, EDN, FIN
<u>HB 2035</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. Prohibits an insurer from requiring a doctor's referral for annual covered mammograms.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 1876</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DENTAL HYGIENISTS. Requires a dental hygienist license to be prominently displayed at all times in the office where the dental hygienist is employed or practices.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 1965</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR PHARMACISTS. Clarifies the continuing education requirement for pharmacists.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 1955</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOME CARE. Appropriates funds to cover staffing and other initial costs associated with the licensing of home care agencies. Effective July 1, 2012.	HLT, FIN



<u>HB 1960</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS. Prohibits retailers from displaying or storing tobacco products through self-service display or engaging in tobacco product retailing through self-service display.	HLT, JUD
<u>HB 2276</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SKATEBOARDS. Requires any person under the age of sixteen to wear a helmet while operating a skateboard. Establishes a fine.	HLT, JUD
<u>HB 1953</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE. Makes an appropriation to expand emergency medical services and ambulance services on the Leeward Coast of Oahu. Makes a grant pursuant to Chapter 42F to Wahiawa General Hospital to provide additional emergency room services.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1846</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST WAHIAWA GENERAL HOSPITAL. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds of up to \$3,000,000, for Wahiawa General Hospital to construct health care facilities. Effective July 1, 2012.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1952</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BONE MARROW TRANSPLANTS. Appropriates matching funds for Hawaii Pacific Health to establish a bone marrow transplant center.	HLT, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 2 copies (including an original) to Room 310 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For comments less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 586-6281(for Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islanders without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web);

WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
