HB 2447
Status

RELATING TO FURNISHING THE DATE OF VITAL EVENTS TO
GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES WITHIN THE STATE OF HAWAII
THAT REQUEST VERIFICATION.

HLT, JUD, FIN

Amends section 338-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to allow the
Department of Health to disclose dates of vital events to governmental
agencies within the State of Hawaii seeking verification of information
contained in vital statistics records for purposes of updating official
lists.

HB 2568
Status

RELATING TO BACKGROUND CHECKS.

HLT, JUD, FIN

Permits the department of health to identify a designee to perform
background checks on its behalf as may be required by law and
relating to employment, contracting, licensure, certification, or
volunteer status.

HB 2563
Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII IMMUNIZATION REGISTRY.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Authorizes the Department of Health to allow limited health insurer
access to the Hawaii Immunization Registry and authorizes the Hawaii
Immunization Registry to store minimal demographic information for
individuals who have elected to refuse inclusion in the Hawaii
Immunization Registry.

Status

RELATING TO LICENSING OF DIETITIANS.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Consolidates licensing of registered dietitians as healthcare
professionals under the Department of Commerce and Consumer
Affairs.



<u>HB 2504</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENTITIES REGULATED BY THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER. Removes confusing and obsolete provisions to streamline licensing process; updates financial regulatory requirements to be more consistent with requirements placed on traditional insurance companies; and modernizes the fee amounts paid by these entities.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 2023</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR NURSING. Makes permanent the assessment and deposit of center for nursing fees into the compliance resolution fund and distribution of those funds to the credit of the center for nursing special fund.	HLT, HED, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.



This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
