Status

Provides a tax credit to any person who purchases a specific safety helmet approved for use by a person sixty-two years of age or older.

HB 2556 Status RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF DEAD HUMAN BODIES.

HLT, FIN

Repeals the authority of the department of health to deliver or

distribute an unclaimed dead human body to a university, hospital, or institution for medical educational and research purposes, and clarifies the responsibilities of the person who has possession, charge, or control of an unclaimed dead human body with respect to gathering

and providing information to state agencies.

This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.
