Department of Health to disclose dates of vital events to governmental agencies within the State of Hawaii seeking verification of information contained in vital statistics records for purposes of updating official

lists.

SB 2821 (SSCR2195)

RELATING TO MORTALITY REVIEW OF DEATHS OF PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL OR INTELLECTUAL

DISABILITIES.

Creates a new part in chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, giving the Department of Health the authority to obtain all records for death

review for persons with developmental or intellectual disabilities.

SB 2818 (SSCR2356) Status

RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF DEAD HUMAN BODIES.

Repeals the authority of the department of health to deliver or distribute an unclaimed dead human body to a university, hospital, or institution for medical educational and research purposes, and clarifies

the responsibilities of the person who has possession, charge, or control of an unclaimed dead human body with respect to gathering

and providing information to state agencies.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.
