SB 2308 RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE. HMS, WAM

Requests the executive office on aging of the department of Status & health to conduct an education and awareness campaign on **Testimony** long term care and have the campaign evaluated. Appropriates funds for the long term care education and awareness campaign

and an evaluation of the campaign.

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE. **SB 2309** HMS, WAM

Implements the long-term care partnership program, allowing Status & individuals to qualify for medicaid coverage for continued long-**Testimony**

term care prior to exhausting their assets.

SB 2321 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE. HMS, CPN

Establishes a task force to determine the feasibility of Status & establishing a limited, mandatory, public long-term care **Testimony**

insurance program.

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES. **SB 2466** HMS, WAM

Establishes the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program Special Status & fund into which nursing facility sustainability fees shall be **Testimony** deposited. Requires the department of human services to charge and collect a provider fee on health care items or services provided by nursing facilities. Effective July 1, 2012,

and repealed on June 30, 2013.

SB 2307 RELATING TO KUPUNA CARE. HMS, WAM

Appropriates funds for the kupuna care program. Requires Status & executive office on aging to establish a sliding fee schedule for **Testimony**

the kupuna care program.

SB 2320 RELATING TO AGING. HMS, WAM

Establishes the aging and disability resource center in the Status & executive office on aging. Appropriates funds for the aging and **Testimony** disability resource center, kupuna care program, healthy aging partnership program, senior centers, and elder registration

services.

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. **SB 2310**

Appropriates funds to the department of human services to match federal funds allocated to the State for medicaid benefits

dedicated to adult vision services.

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Status &

Authorizes certain caregivers to execute an affidavit for caregiver consent on behalf of a minor to allow the minor to participate fully in programs and services under the Individuals with Disabilities Act and section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of

1973.

SB 2318

RELATING TO ADULT GUARDIANSHIP AND PROTECTIVE PROCEEDINGS JURISDICTION.

Status & **Testimony**

Adopts the Uniform Adult Guardianship and Protective Proceedings Jurisdiction Act, to ensure that only one state has jurisdiction at any one time. Contains specific guidelines to specify which court has jurisdiction to appoint a guardian or conservator for an incapacitated adult. Prioritizes the states that may claim jurisdiction.

SB 2313

RELATING TO BACKGROUND CHECKS.

HMS, JDL

Status & **Testimony**

Requires the department of human services to allow persons to conduct child and vulnerable adult abuse perpetrator checks on the department's website as part of background checks for employment, volunteer, licensure, or certification purposes.

SB 2314

RELATING TO THE ELDERLY.

HMS, JDL

Status & **Testimony**

Creates the crime of financial exploitation of dependent elder and provides enhanced penalties. Requires financial institutions to report suspected financial abuse to the adult protective services and the county police. Requires two signatures of unrelated persons as witnesses to the execution of a power of attorney for health care.

SB 2450

RELATING TO SENTENCING.

HMS, JDL

Status & **Testimony**

Establishes mandatory minimum prison terms for certain offenses committed against persons 60 years of age or older.

SB 2317

RELATING TO TAXATION.

HMS, WAM

Status & **Testimony**

Establishes three new tax credits for caregivers: small business caregiver leave tax credit; caregiver tax credit based on a percentage of adjusted gross income; caregiver educational cost tax credit.

SB 2022

RELATING TO TAXATION.

HMS, WAM

Status & **Testimony**

Exempts for income tax purposes any amounts received by grandparents for providing child care services to their

grandchildren.

SB 2301

RELATING TO CHILD VISITATION.

HMS, JDL

Status & Testimony

Permits family court to award reasonable visitation to grandparents if the denial of visitation would cause significant harm to the child. Establishes a rebuttable presumption that visitation decisions made by a parent are in the best interests of the child. Presumption may be rebutted by certain evidence. Identifies factors the court shall consider in awarding visitation. Effective July 1, 2012.

SB 3061

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HMS, CPN

Status & Testimony

Requires life insurance policies that offer long-term care benefits [Measure added to include an accelerated death benefits provision.
