Amends section 46-15.1(b), HRS, to clarify that affordable housing credits shall be issued for each single-family residence, multi-family unit, other residential unit, or if allowed under the county's affordable housing programs, vacant lot, developed by the department of Hawaiian home lands under specified conditions and requirements and shall be freely-transferrable. Prohibits county limitations relating to application of the credits. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HSG, HAW, FIN

SB 2804, SD2 (SSCR2773) Status RELATING TO THE HAWAII INTERAGENCY COUNCIL ON HSG, FIN HOMELESSNESS.

Establishes the Hawaii interagency council on homelessness to be administratively placed within the department of human services. Makes an appropriation for administrative expenses. Repeals 06/30/22. (SD2)
