<u>HB 556</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATUTES OF LIMITATIONS. Removes the statute of limitations for any felony offense under chapter 707, part V relating to sexual offenses and part VI relating to child abuse.	JUD
<u>HB 573</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OBSCENITY. Creates the misdemeanor offense of a minor electronically communicating indecent material. Creates the offense of possession of indecent material electronically communicated by a minor, which is a misdemeanor if committed by a minor and a class C felony if committed by an adult.	JUD
<u>HB 1672</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes monetary awards for whistleblowers providing information that is the basis for any DOTAX administrative or judicial action for violations of tax laws.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1695</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Prohibits penalties for substantial understatements or misstatements and for erroneous claims for refund or credit from being added to tax underpayments on which certain other penalties are already imposed.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1785</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes a 4-year amnesty program for certain delinquent tax obligations.	JUD, FIN

RELATING TO THE REAPPORTIONMENT COMMISSION.
Places the reapportionment commission within the office of elections for administrative purposes. Directs the chief election officer to request an appropriation from the general fund to support the commission, to be effective in the year in which the commission is constituted.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
