707, part V relating to sexual offenses and part VI relating to child

abuse.

Creates the misdemeanor offense of a minor electronically

communicating indecent material. Creates the offense of possession of indecent material electronically communicated by a minor, which is a

misdemeanor if committed by a minor and a class C felony if

committed by an adult.

HB 1672

RELATING TO TAXATION.

JUD, FIN

Status

Establishes monetary awards for whistleblowers providing information that is the basis for any DOTAX administrative or judicial action for

violations of tax laws.

HB 1695

RELATING TO TAXATION.

<u>Status</u>

Prohibits penalties for substantial understatements or misstatements and for erroneous claims for refund or credit from being added to tax

underpayments on which certain other penalties are already imposed.

HB 1785

RELATING TO TAXATION.

Status

Establishes a 4-year amnesty program for certain delinquent tax

obligations.

HB 1892 Status

RELATING TO THE REAPPORTIONMENT COMMISSION.

Places the reapportionment commission within the office of elections

for administrative purposes. Directs the chief election officer to request an appropriation from the general fund to support the commission, to be effective in the year in which the commission is

constituted.

HB 1927 Status

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION-LAW.

Changes certain deadlines for campaign spending preliminary and

supplemental reports.
