<u>HB 2474</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PRISON LITIGATION. Imposes certain limitations and conditions on in forma pauperis prisoner lawsuits.	PBM, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2601</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE SERVICE OF PROCESS. Update the statutes to authorize persons authorized by the courts to serve legal process.	PBM, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2226</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AN AUTOMATED VICTIM NOTIFICATION SYSTEM. Establishes the crime victim notification special fund. Requires a 4% surcharge on all inmate commissary purchases, to be deposited into the fund. Requires commission revenue on inmate telephone usage to be deposited into the fund.	PBM, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2063</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Makes appropriations for various rehabilitation, reentry, and job skill programs of the department of public safety.	PBM, FIN
<u>HB 2848</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Requires the Department of Public Safety to plan for a model wellness center that employs native Hawaiian cultural practices on state land and to submit a report to the legislature prior to the 2013 legislative session.	PBM, HAW, FIN
<u>HB 1723</u> <u>(HSCR45-12)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE TRICARE PROGRAM. Excludes from the general excise tax, amounts received by a managed care support contractor of the TRICARE program for the actual cost or advancement to third party health care providers pursuant to a contract with the United States. Effective	HLT, PBM, FIN



<u>HB 2774</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO A SYMBOL OF MILITARY HONOR AND SACRIFICE. Designates the Honor and Remember Flag as the State's emblem of service and sacrifice by the brave men and women of the United States Armed Forces who have given their lives in the line of duty.	PBM, FIN
<u>HB 2353</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS CEMETERIES. Requires that the general obligation fund appropriation for land acquisition for expansion of burial space for the veterans cemetery in Makawao, Maui, also be used for planning, design, and construction of the burial space. Appropriates funds. Effective July 1, 2012.	PBM, FIN
<u>HB 1974</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS. Removes the residency requirements for the burial of members of the armed services and their dependants in veterans cemeteries.	PBM, FIN
<u>HB 1968</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CIGARETTES. Appropriates funds for reduced ignition propensity cigarette program for two full-time positions and costs to fulfill requirements of section 132C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	PBM, FIN
<u>HB 1872</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HURRICANE PROPERTY INSURANCE. Decreases hurricane property insurance rates to 1992 levels until the hurricane property insurers draft a map based upon actual hurricane damage.	PBM, CPC, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


