<u>SB 2380</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Requires the state tax department to grant counties access to the State's income tax database for real property tax purposes.	PGM/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2261</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED PROGRAM. Establishes the weed and seed program under the department of labor and industrial relations. Makes appropriation.	PGM/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2225</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PRISON LITIGATION. Imposes certain limitations and conditions on in forma pauperis prisoner lawsuits.	PGM/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2253</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Establishes a two-year parole pilot program for no more than twenty inmates to be subject to high-intensity parole supervision. Makes an appropriation for the program.	PGM/JDL, WAM
<u>SB 2776</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Based on analysis and policy options developed as part of the justice reinvestment initiative. Amends statutes to require a pre-trial risk assessment to be conducted within three working; expand the parole board and require the use of validated risk assessments to guide parole decisions; limit length of incarceration for first-time parole violators; increase victim restitution payments by inmates; require a period of parole supervision prior to the maximum sentence date.	PGM/JDL, WAM
