> Based on analysis and policy options developed as part of the justice reinvestment initiative. Amends statutes to require a pretrial risk assessment to be conducted within three working; expand the parole board and require the use of validated risk assessments to guide parole decisions; limit length of incarceration for first-time parole violators; increase victim restitution payments by inmates; require a period of parole

supervision prior to the maximum sentence date.
