<u>HB 1972</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. Limits DLNR fees for its comprehensive historic preservation program to amounts sufficient to cover the annual operating costs of the program, taking into account all other sources of program income.	WLO/HAW, FIN
<u>HB 2246</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HAIKU VALLEY. Establishes the Haiku Valley cultural preserve commission to provide policy and management oversight of the Haiku Valley cultural preserve. Initiates process of conveying Haiku valley in fee simple to the department of land and natural resouces.	WLO/HAW, FIN
<u>HB 2398</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LAND USE. Establishes the Honokohau marina development district on the island of Hawaii.	WLO/HAW, FIN
<u>HB 2521</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PUBLIC TRUST LANDS. Conveys Kakaako Makai lands to Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and resolves all disputes and controversies, and extinguishes, discharges and bars all claims, suits, and actions relating to OHA's portion of income and proceeds from the public trust lands for the period November 7, 1978 through June 30, 2012	WLO/HAW, JUD, FIN



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 4 copies (including an original) to Room 438 in the State Capitol;



WEB: For comments less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
