<u>HB 2358</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE BUILDING CODE. Establishes the Hawaii State Building Code, Hawaii State Building Code Council, and Natural Disaster Preparedness Commission. Effective July 1, 2012.	WLO, PBM, FIN
<u>HB 2434</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE. Abolishes the State Building Code Council, provides for a transition from the current to the new proposed law, and requires the counties to adopt building codes with their revisions or opt out of adoption.	WLO, FIN


