<u>SB 2184</u> <u>(SSCR2462)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PRIVATE TRANSFER FEES. Makes permanent the prohibition of private fees for a future transfer of real property.	WLO, CPC/JUD
<u>SB 2378, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2731)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LEGACY LANDS. Requires nonprofit land conservation organizations to provide, in addition to a conservation easement, a deed restriction or covenant, as a condition to the receipt of funds under the legacy land program. Requires the board of land and natural resources to be made a full or partial owner of any conservation provided by a state or county agency or nonprofit land conservation organization as a condition for receipt of funding under the legacy lands program. Allows for the exemption of the easement requirements by the board. Requires applicants for legacy land funds to submit the project's public benefit and to consult with the staff of the department of land and natural resources, the department of agriculture, the agribusiness development corporation, and the public land development corporation. <u>SB 2381, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2567)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES MARITIME FACILITIES. Allows DLNR to work on projects within lands or facilities under the jurisdiction of the division of boating and ocean recreation without the approval of county agencies. Effective 07/01/50. (SD1)	WLO, FIN
<u>SB 2849, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2492)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SAILING SCHOOL VESSELS. Amends the definition of "sailing school vessel" to mean, among other things, a vessel that is in compliance with part 169 of title 46 Code of Federal Regulations. (SD1)	WLO, JUD



<u>SB 2850, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2487)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GROUNDED VESSELS. Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to assume control of and remove a vessel grounded on a coral reef or in imminent danger of breaking apart if the vessel cannot be removed by the owner within twenty-four hours of the grounding. Provides requirements to allow the owner of the vessel to continue an effort to salvage a grounded vessel beyond twenty-four hours under certain conditions and allows the department to grant more time to the owner to remove the vessel if no additional environmental damage exists. (SD1)	WLO, FIN
<u>SB 2906, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2445)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THRILL CRAFT. Allows thrill craft to be used to conduct ocean cleanup activities. Requires DLNR to adopt rules. (SD1)	WLO, FIN
<u>SB 2933, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2601)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO OCEAN SAFETY. Requires the department of land and natural resources to adopt rules that promote greater safety of ocean users in the State's nearshore waters. Appropriates funds for swim zone buoys at Kamaole beach. Requires a report to the legislature. (SD2)	WLO, FIN
<u>SB 2857, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2547)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST DAM AND RESERVOIR OWNERS. Allows the authorization of the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist dam and reservoir owners upon ratification of a constitutional amendment authorizing the issuance. (SD1)	WLO, FIN
<u>SB 3001, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2591)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WILDLIFE. Prohibits the interisland transfer, transport, or release after transport of wild or feral mammals, with certain exceptions; establishes mandatory fines. (SD2)	WLO, JUD
<u>SB 2918, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2805)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT. Transfers the management responsibilities and development rights of the stadium authority for certain parcels of land to the public land development corporation. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	WLO, FIN


