SB 2341, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1258-12)

RELATING TO LAND USE.

AGR/ERB, WLO

Status

Repeals the prohibition on agricultural tourism activities in the absence of a bona fide farming operation. Repeals the prohibition on ordinances that allow overnight accommodations in agricultural districts. Authorizes agricultural tourism activities, including overnight accommodations of twenty-one days or less, for any one stay within a county with a population greater than two hundred and fifty thousand people, but less than five hundred thousand people; provided that the county has adopted ordinances regulating agricultural tourism. Effective July 1, 2112. (SB2341 HD1)

SB 2646, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1185-12) Status

RELATING TO BUILDING PERMITS.

AGR, WLO

Exempts specified nonresidential agricultural and aquacultural buildings and structures, and their appurtenances, located on commercial farms and ranches located outside of the urban district from certain building permit requirements, under certain conditions.

Effective January 20, 2020. (SB2646 HD1)

SB 2350, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1184-12) **Status**

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

AGR, WLO

Allows the building of ohana dwellings on lands within an agricultural district in any county with a population of 500,000 or less, under certain conditions. Effective January 20, 2020. (SB2350 HD1)

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SB 2375, SD3, HD1 (HSCR1259-12) Status	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL-BASED COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS. Defines agricultural-based commercial operations and authorizes agricultural-based commercial operations in agricultural districts. Includes agricultural-based commercial operations under the definition of "farming operation" in chapter 165, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Effective January 20, 2020. (SB2375 HD1)	AGR/ERB, WLO
HCR 61 / HR 41 Status / Status	IN SUPPORT OF DECLARING THE SERPENT'S HEAD COWRY SHELL AS THE HAWAII STATE SEA SHELL.	WLO
HCR 169 Status	URGING THE COUNTIES TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT COMMUNITY CONCERNS COUNCILS IN RURAL AREAS.	WLO
