SB 2341, SD2, HD1  
(HSCR1258-12)  
Status

RELATING TO LAND USE.  
Repeals the prohibition on agricultural tourism activities in the absence  
of a bona fide farming operation. Repeals the prohibition on  
ordinances that allow overnight accommodations in agricultural  
districts. Authorizes agricultural tourism activities, including  
overnight accommodations of twenty-one days or less, for any one stay  
within a county with a population greater than two hundred and fifty  
thousand people, but less than five hundred thousand people; provided  
that the county has adopted ordinances regulating agricultural tourism.  
Effective July 1, 2112. (SB2341 HD1)


