SUBJECT: GM 633 – State Council on Developmental Disabilities Gubernatorial Nominee Sol Ray Duncan

The State Council on Developmental Disabilities (DD) **STRONGLY SUPPORTS GM 633** to confirm the nomination of Sol Ray Duncan for a term to expire June 30, 2016.

The Council's Federal mandate (P.L.106-402) is clear in determining the composition of this body to ensure that all the players involved in the development, implementation, and use of DD supports are represented. The law specifically requires that 60 percent of the membership of the Council be comprised of individuals with DD, their parents, or family members. Additionally, the following are required to be on the Council: relevant State entities; State entities that administer funds provided under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; the Older Americans Act of 1965; Titles V and XIX of the Social Security Act; the Protection and Advocacy Agency; the Centers for Excellence in DD Education, Research, and Service; local and non-governmental agencies, and private non-profit groups concerned with services for individuals with DD.

Mr. Duncan's appointment to the Council would fulfill the Federal requirement for representatives of individuals with DD. He is a young man who lives independently in an apartment in Pearl City operated by the Arc in Hawaii. Since July 2010, he has been attending the Council meetings, Council's Employment and Education Committee meetings, and Day at the Capitol events. His commitment and dedication to serve on the Council is evident by his consistent attendance and participation.

In addition to the above, Mr. Duncan is a member of the Pearl City Neighborhood Board, the current President of Arc Advocates, and an active member of the Self-Advocacy Advisory Council (SAAC). individuals who cannot speak for themselves. He was actively involved with SAAC in advocating before the Legislature to pass legislation to remove the "R" (retarded) word from State Statutes and participated in the Governor's signing of the bill as Act 220/11.

Mr. Duncan's experience in living independently and his active involvement in the community would assist the Council in achieving its State Plan Goal in Community Supports that states, "People with developmental disabilities will receive the necessary supports to live self-determined lives and have equal access under the law." He is an example of someone who is self-determined and living life to the fullest.

We look forward to Mr. Duncan's appointment to serve on the Council and his continued participation on SAAC.
