Thank you for the opportunity to support the appointment of Lorraine Akiba as a Hawaii Public Utilities Commissioner.

As you already know, I have been in my position as Chair of the Commission for one year now and everyday is a continuing learning experience. Even for someone as knowledgeable as Commission Mike Champley, with his extensive utility background, or Commissioner John Cole, as the Consumer Advocate prior to his appointment, no prior experience can ever prepare a Commissioner for the demands of the position or the multi-dimensional aspect of the job. So in making an appointment to the PUC, it is extremely important to appoint a person with the appropriate disposition for the task. I believe Lorraine Akiba has the right personal attributes and skill set to take on this important responsibility. She is extremely intelligent and articulate and her professional career and previous tenure in public service are held in very high regard.

In describing what personal attributes are desirable, Scott Hempling, the former Executive Director of the National Regulatory Research Institute says the following:

An effective regulator is purposeful, decisive, and independent. A purposeful regulator defines the public interest by articulating a vision. A decisive regulator acts to align utilities' and consumers' private behavior with that vision. An independent regulator accepts the pressures of public-interest politics (the need to make tradeoffs among meritorious but conflicting goals) but avoids the distortions of private-interest politics (the pressures from narrow forces seeking benefits for themselves). Recognizing that commissions are not courts and regulators are not judges, she not only presides; she leads.

She rejects the rhetorical bipolarity of "markets versus regulation" because she understands, per Dr. Alfred Kahn, that her "central, continuing responsibility" is "finding the best possible mix of inevitably imperfect regulation and inevitably imperfect competition." She prefers facts and logic over adjectives and adverbs.



Chair Baker, Vice Chair Taniguchi and Members of the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection, I submit testimony in strong support of Lorraine Akiba and ask your favorable consideration and confirmation of her appointment to the Public Utilities Commission (PUC).

laws, and alternative and renewable energy development. It can be a key catalyst in accomplishing Hawaii's sustainability goals in all sectors that fall within its purview.

From my work as a commercial litigation attorney and head of my firm's environmental practice group, I have legal experience and substantive knowledge which can bring added value to the PUC, including financial, real estate and business law and environmental and natural resources law background. In particular, I have represented clients involved in the alternative energy industry such as independent power producers and developers in wind, solar and biomass energy generation; and financial and investment entities who specialize in alternative energy company acquisition and investments.

I have served pro bono for many years as an arbitrator for the Court Annexed Arbitration Program (CAAP) where I have adjudicated and decided legal cases under the CAAP program. I will bring those decision making skills and experience as skill sets to my duties as commissioner in hearings and contest case dockets.

I also have administrative agency and decision making experience from my tenure as the State of Hawaii Director of Labor and Industrial Relations during the Cayetano administration. I had responsibility for administration and oversight of policies and operations or all program divisions and attached administrative agencies under the DLIR. I was responsible for management of 600+ employees statewide including fiscal budgeting, human resources, union grievances and labor grievances with the HGEA. As DLIR Director I also engaged in decision making for contested case matters under the Disability Compensation Division, Unemployment Insurance Division, Wage Enforcement Division and Hawaii Occupational Safety and Health Division. I am familiar with complex regulatory issues and the need for fair, objective, well reasoned and efficient decision making.

As a member of the PUC, I will bring my analytical skills to assist the Commission with thorough and detailed analysis of recommendations and information in matters brought before the Commission. I will also help to facilitate dialogue and communications with and among the various stakeholders in the industry areas under the PUC's regulatory jurisdiction.

In closing, I would like to thank the Committee for your leadership and hard work on behalf of the people of the State of Hawaii. I appreciate the opportunity to be here today and your consideration of my nomination. Mahalo again to everyone who submitted testimony on my behalf and to those who are also here in attendance supporting me today.
