Dear Senator Jill Tokuda and members of the Committee.

I want to thank Governor Neil Abercrombie for nominating me. It is with great honor and a privilege to be considered as an Advisory Board Member of the Hawaii State Center for Nursing (HSCFN). Below are my responses to the following questions:

1. Why do you wish to be a member of the Center for Nursing Advisory Board?

The purpose of the HSCFN is to address the nursing workforce issues. It is projected that by 2020, there will be a significant nursing shortage in the state of Hawaii, as well as nationally. As an Advisory Board member, I have creative, cost-effective ideas to addressing the nursing shortage issues. One idea is to continue to support programs, such as the Nursing Advocates & Mentors, Inc. (NAMI), which provides free NCLEX-RN review for nurses who graduated from foreign countries.

2. How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Center for Nursing Advisory Board?

The role and responsibilities of the HSCFN Advisory Board member are to analyze reports related to nursing workforce trends and provide recommendations regarding current and future programs to address any negative trends; to support and promote research through evidence-based nursing conferences, such as the Pacific Institute of Nursing (PIN); and to implement strategies to recruit and retain nurses.

3. Given your understanding of the role and responsibilities of a member of the Center for Nursing Advisory Board, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position?

I believe I am qualified for the position based on my educational background and professional experience. I obtained my PhD in Nursing in 2003 at the UCLA School of Nursing and completed a 1-year post-doctoral fellowship at the VA Greater Los Angeels Healthcare System in 2004. I worked as an Assistant Professor at the UH Manoa School of Nursing, where I implemented the Adult Health Clinical Nurse Specialist Program. I have written and obtained several research and training grants and have published in peer-reviewed journals. My research experience, knowledge in statistics, and work experience as a staff nurse and as an advanced practice nurse (APRN) will aid in my decision-making ability as a member of the HSCFN Advisory Board.

4. What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

During my term of service, I hope to implement new programs and support current existing programs that promote retention of nurses, as well as work with hospitals and various health care settings to improve nursing care.

- 5. Name three qualities that best describe you and that would make you stand out. How would these qualities benefit the Center for Nursing Advisory Board?
 - 1) Team player: I am a team player and work well with multi-disciplinary professionals.
 - 2) Creative: I am able to "think outside the box" to come up with creative solutions.
 - 3) Caring and passionate: I believe that it is our duty as nurses to provide evidence-based, quality care to our patients and their families.
- 6. Name one previous experience that would make you stand out. How would this benefit the Center for Nursing Advisory Board?

I moved from California to Hawaii in 2005. One of the things I have learned is that people in Hawaii love to talk stories. So, I would like to share a personal story with you.

My father was an Air Force pilot in the Philippines. At the age of 2, I was the mascot for his squadron. As a mascot, it was routine to take me with them when they flew. One day, they received an assignment to test fly a plane. They took me along with them. There were 8 of us total in the plane. What was supposed to be a routine flight turned into a tragedy. Shortly after take-off, our plane crashed in the sea, killing 6 people including my father, while 2 of us survived. At the age of 2, I didn't know how to swim. Fortunately, whether part of his job or not, a Lieutenant Ricafort saved me from the crash. If it weren't for his courage, his compassionate leadership, and his will, I wouldn't be here today.

Because of this personal experience, I have tried to devote my life in service. I served as an Active Duty Nurse Corps Office in the U.S. Navy and have volunteered countless hours in various organizations, such as the Kidney Foundation, Heart Touch, Hawaii Prostate Cancer Coalition, and NAMI. This internal motivation to service will serve me well as an Advisory Board member of the HSCFN.

7. Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interests that could arise during your service on the Center for Nursing Advisory Board? How would you overcome any possible conflicts of interest?
