Dear Senator Fukunaga,

Please let me introduce myself. My name is Thomas Lim, and I have been nominated to serve on the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board. Attached are my resume and three references (* Item 1).

First, let me thank you for the opportunity to provide this written statement. To start with a brief account of my background, I was fortunate from 2004 to 2005 to have worked in the field of historic preservation in Hawai'i, enriching my understanding of architecture to help others realize the beauty and potential inherent in our historic built environment. I believe historic preservation is important not only for an understanding of our past but as an invaluable context to our present development of Hawai'i, and more, as an essential guide to future generations, connecting them to their cultural heritage. I would appreciate an opportunity to contribute and serve again. (Item 2a)

As the former architecture branch chief in the Department of Land and Natural Resources, State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD), I have a clear understanding of the administrative responsibilities, duties and roles of the members of the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board and of the nomination process to the Hawaii Register of Historic Places. (Item 2b)

At SHPD I was involved with the pre- and post-design consultations with DAGS's Planning and Construction Management Branches to safeguard our state historic properties, such as the renovation at Washington Place and improvement and repairs at the State Capitol Building, in addition to non-state projects like the Kawaiaha'o Church renovations and the Kakaako Fire Station Museum. I gained invaluable experience working with the National Trust for Historic Preservation in negotiations with the military branch services/federal agencies for prominent public projects such as the new Visitor's Center at the *USS Arizona* Memorial and NOAA's new Pacific Region Center at Ford Island. (Item 2f)

In addition to working at SHPD, I have over a dozen years of progressively responsible professional experience and practice in architecture. Hence I bring insights and appreciation stemming from both an academic and a practical perspective, as well as a complete set of skills including preparation of construction documents, project design, project management, master planning, project administration, and project budgeting. I believe all my experiences help qualify me to serve on the board. (Item 2c)

This forthcoming four-year term will provide important opportunities to comment on and to protect possible candidates for the registry, significant historic buildings/structures that will be becoming eligible for the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places. These include a cohort of buildings built during the era of early statehood from the late 1950's to 1960's, some institutional and some private residences. Moving forward, as Hawai'i continues to evolve and transform itself, it will be important to chronicle its emergence into the next Pacific century that is rooted in its past while envisioning a sustainable cultural built environment. (Item 2d)

In my current position as Director of Planning Management Systems Office (PMSO) with the University of Hawai'i-Manoa's College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources (CTAHR), my primary responsibility is to assist the Dean to manage, direct and plan for the tripartite land-grant mission of instruction, research and extension services, executed at CTAHR's Manoa campus facilities and 22 off-campus research/extension stations covering 1,600 acres on five islands. Miller Hall, a CTAHR building on the Manoa campus, is on the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places. With that in mind, I will recuse myself regarding any of the university's historic buildings or those potentially eligible for the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places. (Item 2g)

In sum, I bring a diverse background and eclectic, forward-looking interests from many fields spanning my former career in biochemistry and medicine to my personal passions: interest in the Hawaii International Film Festival (a former independent film entry reviewer and synopsis writer for HIFF); astronomy/physics; human genomics, proteomics and cell circuitry; and cognitive neuroscience/Human Connectome Project. The three qualities I bring to the review broad are strong historical respect of the past, practical professional and administrative experiences, and a diverse and broad perspective to give context to our unique Island culture and society that reflects its historical context. I ask for your support in my nomination to serve the Hawai'i Historic Place Review Board. Thank you for time and consideration for the opportunity to participate in the civic responsibility of protecting our historic treasures. (Item 2e)

In consideration of **GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 795** SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE HAWAII HISTORIC PLACES REVIEW BOARD, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, THOMAS LIM, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2016

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) strongly supports the gubernatorial appointment of Thomas Lim to the Hawaii Historic Places Review Board for a term to expire 6-30-2016.

The Hawaii Historic Places Review Board was established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to: (1) Order and enter historic properties into the Hawaii Register of Historic Places on the basis of their value to Hawaii's heritage; (2) Evaluate and, when appropriate, recommend the nomination of historic properties to the National Register of Historic Places; (3) Review the State Survey of Historic Properties; (4) Review the content of the State Historic Preservation Plan; and (5) Maintain the Hawaii Register of Historic Places (including all those listed on the National Register of Historic Places). State law requires that the Hawaii Historic Places Review Board include at least one professionally qualified member of each of the following disciplines: archaeology, architecture, history, and sociology. In addition, there shall be one person knowledgeable in traditional Hawaiian society and culture.

Mr. Lim is the Director of the Planning and Management System of the University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources. He holds a Master of Architecture Degree from the University of Hawaii. He has worked on numerous island preservation projects such as Washington Place, Fort Kamehameha housing, Tripler Hospital, Kuhio Highway, and Windward Community College. He is also a past Architecture Branch Chief with the Hawaii Historic Preservation Division (SHPD) of the Department. Mr. Lim's experience would facilitate interaction between the Historic Places Review Board and SHPD.

My name is Holly McEldowney and I am, as an individual, submitting testimony in support of Thomas Lim's nomination to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board (Review Board). I believe the deliberations of the Review Board would definitely benefit from Mr. Lim's participation. This includes evaluating the eligibility of historic properties for listing in the Hawai'i and/or Nation Register of Historic Places and fulfilling the Review Board's responsibility to participate in development of the state historic preservation plan and to review the state survey of historic properties maintained by the State Historic Preservation Division (§6E-5.5(B), Hawaii Revised Statutes).

I first worked with Mr. Lim at the State Historic Preservation Division when he was the Division's Architecture Branch Chief and I was his immediate supervisor as the Division's Acting Administrator. After we both left the Division, we have periodically discussed various projects encountered in our respective work. I am currently an archaeologist with the Division of State Parks, Department of Land and Natural Resources.

There are two things in particular that I appreciate about working with Mr. Lim. First, his perspectives on historic properties and historic preservation always illustrated his enthusiasm for architecture and its history as well as his many years of practical experience in the design of buildings and other structures. This combination was especially useful when trying to convince owners or agencies that historic properties could be used in many ways while still maintaining their historic character as much as possible. Second, he has the capacity to be genuinely interested in a wide range of subjects, particularly those related to the sciences and the history of ideas. This is likely to broaden the Review Board's consideration of what makes historic properties potentially significant. It also enables him to understand the scientific value of archaeology sites and what these sites can contribute, individually and collectively, to our understanding of the past.
