Honorable Chair and Members of the House Committee on Finance, thank you for the opportunity to provide you with comments regarding House Bill 1398, relating to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA).

The HPHA <u>supports</u> enactment of the measure, which would add a section to Chapter 356D to explicitly authorize our agency to enter into public-private partnerships for the increased development of new public housing developments, as well as the improvement of existing public housing units. The public-private partnership model for the improvement of public housing projects is currently being encouraged by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the HPHA has demonstrated the success that is possible through such agreements with the mixed finance public-private partnership at Kuhio Park Terrace. The value of this project is manifest: \$150 million in capital repairs have been removed from the agency's backlog of physical needs and the Agency is requesting to reappropriate \$13,450,000 from the current Biennium Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget previously allocated to this property.

This measure proposes a statutory amendment that would provide the agency with greater flexibility and control over the process. It would offer certain limited exemptions from the procurement code and allow the exercise of rulemaking authority to go forward to other housing developments statewide and further reduce the capital needs of the HPHA. Such future projects would lessen HPHA reliance on diminishing Federal Capital Funds and State CIP funds while enabling our agency to improve our existing public housing stock and investigate the development of new affordable options statewide.

HB 1398

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY.

Chair Oshiro, Vice Chair Lee, and committee members, thank you for the opportunity to testify on HB 1398 that authorizes the authority to develop a partnership or development agreement with a private party, that would be exempt from public disclosure and open competition pursuant to HRS chapter 103D.

The State Procurement Office (SPO) opposes the exemption language on page 2, lines 13 to 21 of this bill. Any governmental agency with the authority to expend funds should be in compliance with Chapter 103D, which promotes the policy of fair and equitable treatment of all persons who deal with procurement system; fosters effective broad-based competition and increases public confidence in public procurement.

Public procurement's primary objective is to provide everyone equal opportunity to compete for government contracts, to prevent favoritism, collusion or fraud in awarding of contracts.

There is no compelling reason to statutorily exempt the HPHA from the requirements of HRS chapter 103D. To legislate that any one agency should be exempt from compliance with HRS chapter 103D conveys a sense of disproportionate equality in the law's application.

Honorable Chair, Vice Chair and Committee Members;

The Hawaii Building & Construction Trades Council, AFL-CIO which was originally chartered in October of 1958 is comprised of 16 out of 17 construction trade unions throughout Hawaii. With an estimated membership of 20,000 statewide, our primary mission is to provide employment opportunities and living wages for many of Hawaii's working men and women we represent.

The Council SUPPORTS the general intent of HB1398, which authorizes the Hawaii public housing authority to develop public housing projects under a partnership or development agreement with a private party.

Portions of this measure promote the development of additional safe and affordable public housing for the well-being of Hawaii's residents. The Council agrees that public-private partnerships can serve as a viable option that may create such opportunities, however, we are concerned with sections of this bill that "broadly" exempt such prospective public housing projects from chapters 103 and 103D and how the proposed exemptions may affect the continued applicability of chapters 104 and other industry-related provisions. Further, such sweeping exemptions may adversely impact our members and their opportunity to work on such projects.

Although generally speaking we support such well-intended measures, we remain cautious of changes to, or exemptions from the existing procurement process which are in place to ensure the fair and equitable disposition of state projects. As such, we respectfully request that your committee consider the removal of language providing such exemptions from chapters 103 and 103D.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on HB1398.
