RE: H.B. 1709:

Relating to Offenses Against the Public Order

Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee:

This measure would create a new offense of aggravated harassment by impersonation. Under this measure, a person would commit the offense of aggravated harassment by impersonation if they commit the offense of harassment by impersonation within five-years of the conviction of a previous offense, or it with the intent to harm, it causes a response by public safety agency personnel.

The Office of the Public Defender opposes H.B. 1709.

The jump from a misdemeanor to a felony is steep. The potential jail time rises from one-year to five-years. The possible fine jumps from two thousand to ten thousand dollars. Rarely does a conviction of a second misdemeanor offense elevate the punishment from a misdemeanor to a felony. For example, abuse of a family or household member is elevated from a misdemeanor offense after the commission of a third offense within two years of a second or subsequent conviction. Operating a vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant is not elevated to a felony offense until the commission of an offense within ten years of three previous convictions.

As for subsection 1(b) of this measure, we fail to understand the need to create a felony offense of harassment by impersonation as it applies to public safety personnel. The misuse of emergency telephone services (Sec. 710-1014.5) is punishable by a year in jail. Perhaps this offense could be amended by including a subsection for the causation of a false alarm via electronic communication.

If this committee is intent of creating a felony offense of harassment by impersonation, we ask that you amend this measure by requiring two prior convictions of the offense within five years.
