RELATING TO ELECTIONS

March 28, 2012

Chair Ige and members of the Senate Committee on Ways and Means, thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill No. 2251. The purpose of this bill is to authorize the county clerk of any county with a population of less than one hundred thousand to mail an absentee ballot to each registered voter of any island of that county not contiguous with the island where the county seat of government is located.

The logistical and administrative issues associated with establishing a polling place on such an island are significant. For example, for the Island of Niihau, these issues include the delivery and return of ballots, voting machines, and associated election materials, in addition to the recruitment of on-island precinct officials to operate the polling place. This bill instead gives the county clerk the ability to give voters in this situation the convenience of an absentee ballot.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill No. 2251.
