Our members feel that the small purchase provisions which escaped the provisions of the procurement code for projects under \$250,000.00 has been working relatively well. There have been a few problems but the benefits outweigh the problems. In the hopes that jobs will get out quicker for our members, as well as for employees that work for us, we can support this bill.

We are, of course aware of the Senate's movement in this area to take the small purchase provision up to \$1,000,000.00, we are opposed to that. We are opposed to it without the protections that are offered under the subcontractor listing clause. If the Committee would consider inserting the provisions of Section 103D-302(b) as a section of the code that would be retained for small purchases, we would be much more amenable to the Senate's position. In the absence of that however, we would highly recommend that the provisions of 103D-302(b) be continued to be required for projects in excess of \$250,000.00.

The Electrical Contractors Association of Hawaii (ECAH) is a non-profit association representing 100 electrical contractors in Hawaii. ECAH is also the Hawaii Chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association. ECAH <u>Supports</u> the intent and purpose of HB2265, HD2 in its entirety making permanent the amendments to Section 103D-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes regarding the small purchase procedures that increases the limits on construction jobs to \$250,000. Of great concern is the preservation to keep the subcontractors list requirement for jobs over \$250,000.

There are concerns among our members that the Senate version may contain language to eliminate the subcontractors list for small purchases up to \$1 million. We would only support the Senate version if provisions of 103D-302 (b) is made part of the bill that requires the listing of all subcontractors along with the nature and scope of work to be performed by each. This would be consistent with provisions of the current Procurement Code. The subcontractor's list keeps a level playing field among all contractors and a good policy for the benefit of taxpayers.
