# In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2325 – RELATING TO BROADBAND

Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Choy, and Members of the Committee on Economic Revitalization & Business:

My name is Gordon J. Bruce, and as the Director of the Department of Information Technology and the Chief Information Officer for the City and County of Honolulu, I submit testimony in opposition of HB 2325.

I appreciate the intent of HB2325, but there are numerous issues that can arise from exempting companies and organizations from obtaining permits.

When in comes to County property, there is a fiduciary responsibility to the constituent, and as such, county officials must comply with the various county laws related to encumbering County lands. As it relates to private property, county officials have a fiduciary responsibility to protect those who live in and around private property.

In addition, many counties require that community input be required. Sunshine laws regulate the placing of such notice, and the scheduling of such meetings, such as at neighborhood boards. The time schedules in the proposed legislation may inhibit the communities from including these items on their agendas negating the ability to provide citizen input.

### **HB2325 RELATING TO BROADBAND**

Chair McKelvey and members of the House Economic Revitalization and Business Committee:

I am Robert Kihune, Chief Executive Officer of Sandwich Isles Communications (SIC), providing testimony in support of HB2325, Relating to Broadband.

SIC has spent nearly two decades building out broadband telecommunications infrastructure across the state to ensure native Hawaiians in remote and rural areas of our state have access to broadband telecommunications services. In order to provide service on Hawaiian Home Lands (HHL), SIC has and will continue to install broadband infrastructure outside of HHL areas. As a result of these critical broadband infrastructure investments, the Hawaiian community today is able to preserve its cultural heritage while capitalizing on opportunities in the global market, through the advanced technology provided by SIC. We believe that broadband technology is an essential element of the State's

economy and vital to the health and welfare of all in the State. From our experience, onerous county and state permitting and approval requirements often cause significant and costly delays to broadband infrastructure deployment. We believe requiring state and county agencies to approve, approve with modifications, or disapprove all broadband related permits within 45 days will help to eliminate these delays thereby attracting much-needed broadband investment in Hawaii.

For these reasons we urge passage of this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony.
