HB 2538, Relating to Exemptions from Child Care Licensing

HB 2538 would add exemptions for any kindergarten, school, or program licensed by the Charter School Review Panel, the Hawaii Council of Private Schools, or any federal agency from child care licensing by the Department of Human Services. HAEYC respectfully opposes this measure in its current form to the extent that it includes children birth through age 5 who receive child care subsidies. The Department of Human Services Child Care licensing process ensures basic health and safety for our youngest keiki.
