- 1 Department's Position: The department of health strongly supports passage of this bill as part of the
- 2 Governor's package.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: The fiscal implications are expected to be negligible and amount to the cost of
- 4 broad administrative oversight.
- 5 Purpose and Justification: The purpose of this bill is to change statutory language to allow DOH to
- 6 use a designee (vendor) to perform background checks as required by law on certain healthcare workers,
- 7 employees, and owners or operators of care homes or other healthcare organizations. DOH is working
- 8 in conjunction with the department of human services Med-QUEST division and the Hawaii Criminal
- 9 Justice Date Center to implement a modern background check system to safeguard the frail, elderly and
- vulnerable populations who are receiving care in or from Hawaii's healthcare facilities or organizations.
- 11 Private vendors are available to perform this service at little or not cost to the state. This bill will allow
- the use of a designee. The department respectfully requests passage of this bill.
