In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2681 RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS

Testimony of the ACLU of Hawaii in Opposition to H.B. 2681, Relating to

Electric Guns

Dear Chair Oshiro and Members of the Committee on Finance:

The ACLU of Hawaii opposes any attempts to reduce the amount of training that law enforcement officers must receive before using lethal weapons such as TASERs or other electric guns. The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals recently concluded that Maui Police Department officers used excessive force in using a TASER on a domestic violence victim, see Mattos v. Agarano, 661 F.3d 433 (2011) (available at

http://www.ca9.uscourts.gov/datastore/opinions/2011/10/17/08-15567.pdf); by lessening training and accreditation standards, the State is exposing itself to liability for excessive force (not to mention putting the safety of the community at risk).

Electric guns ("TASER") are lethal weapons. Hundreds of individuals have died after being "tased," with the TASER being the sole or contributory cause in at least forty cases between 2001 and 2008. Amnesty International, 'Less Than Lethal?' The Use of Stun Weapons in US Law Enforcement 20 (2008). The TASER results in the introduction of a significant amount of electrical current into a person's body and can cause burns and permanent scarring.

Because of a lack of clear policies and inadequate training, TASERS are frequently used by law enforcement officers in situations where deadly force would never be contemplated. Law enforcement officers need more training and better policies, not less. The Department of Land and Natural Resources is no exception.
