#### **RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES**

#### IN SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL 2769 RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES

Dear Senator Espero and Members:

I am Paul Ferreira, the Deputy Police Chief for the Hawai'i Police Department; however, I am providing testimony as the Chair of the Enhanced 911 (E911) Board that is comprised of representatives from each of the Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), representatives of the communications service providers, and representatives from State agencies.

The members of the then Wireless Enhanced 911 Board (Board) were instrumental in the drafting of the legislation that resulted in Act 168 becoming law during the 2011 Legislative Session, providing for amendments to the Hawai'i Revised Statutes, Chapter 138, Enhanced 911 Services. In reviewing the amendments that were implemented into the law, the current Board recognized the need to amend the definition in the law for a "Public safety agency" and approved seeking action during this legislative session.

In Chapter 138, the definition for "Public safety agency" is described currently as a functional governmental entity, which the Board recognized as being too broad of a definition and therefore needs to be amended for clarity. As written, a governmental entity may open the door for other federally funded agencies to seek disbursements from the E911 Fund minimizing the Fund's resources for state and county entities. This measure seeks to restore the former definition for "Public safety agency" establishing that a public safety agency is a functional division of the state or county government that provides for firefighting, law enforcement, ambulance, medical, or other emergency services, which provides the accurate meaning.

For the reasons above, we strongly urge this committee to approve House Bill 2769, Relating to Enhanced 911 Services.




