Senator Green, Senator Nishihara, and other distinguished committee members, I want to thank you for this opportunity to address HCR 12.

My name is Megan Noble and I am a graduate student at the Myron B. Thompson School of Social Work at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. I am testifying in support of HCR 12, to designate January 22-28, as "Reproductive Rights Awareness Week," because it is important for women and men to know women's reproductive health rights.

Recently, there has been media reports about the "War on Women," with political debates between limiting birth control access including outlawing abortion. According to the Guttmacher Institute, in 2011, 1,100 state laws on women's reproductive rights were introduced.
