PURPOSE: The purpose of the resolution is to request the Department of Transportation and the City and County of Honolulu to inspect, clean, and fix the drainage system in East Honolulu.

POSITION: I strongly support this resolution.

BACKGROUND: Starting on March 5, 2012, a week-long storm that included hail and a tornado swept across the State and flooded homes, closed roads, and contributed to the loss of electricity in numerous areas, affecting many businesses and communities. In valleys and low-lying areas, particularly in East Honolulu, extensive flood damage was sustained to homes and property, resulting in financial and emotional hardships for many residents, especially for those in Aina Haina where flood waters reached nearly two feet and damaged at least six homes on Wailupe Place. Flooding in the valleys and low-lying areas of East Honolulu has worsened over the years because antiquated and inadequate sewage and drainage systems have not been able to accommodate the increasing flow from the East Honolulu community. The primary need is to conduct a comprehensive study of the drainage system to identify its deficiencies and implement necessary facilities, maintenance, and operational upgrades.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the resolution is to request the Department of Transportation and the City and County of Honolulu to inspect, clean, and fix the drainage system in East Honolulu.

POSITION: I **strongly support** this resolution.

BACKGROUND: Alongside Wailupe Place road is a state-owned drain pipe that was installed approximately fifty years ago. It was apparently designed to serve Kalanianaole Highway, which was narrower then, and a certain amount of land area.

Unfortunately, this drain was constructed with two 90-degree bends close together which is retarding flow.

Since the original installation of the drain, Kalanianaole Highway has been widened and the areas mauka of the highway have been greatly developed, especially with more paved areas. This situation is causing a tremendous increase in the amount of storm water flowing into the subject drain.

This increased volume of storm water with a tremendous velocity is popping up the drain manhole covers, especially the one at the 90-degree bend, and causing a gushing fountain of storm water which rapidly floods Wailupe Place road and the adjacent areas.

It can be said that the main cause of flooding of the Wailupe Place road and adjacent areas is due to the overflowing of the state-owned drain.

Corrective action should be taken as soon as possible since further modernization of the surrounding areas will increase the volume of storm

water to the subject drain and endanger the health, safety, well being and properties of the residents.

Flooding is caused by a state-owned drain that has overflowed into our neighborhood in 2004, 2005, 2007 and most recently this month, March 2012.

We have lived on Wailupe Place since July 2003. Our neighborhood has experienced extensive flooding in 2004,2005,2007 and March 2012. The flooding is a result of inadequate, and/or poorly designed and maintained drainage system that is suppose to drain water from Kalanianaole Highway and Aina Haina valley to the ocean. However, due to the design of the current drainage system, this water is deposited into our street which causes severe flooding.

We have three young children and we are extremely concerned that this polluted flood water could potentially cause serious health concerns. The department of health issued a warning to stay out of " brown" water for fear of infection. It was impossible to stay out of this water as it surrounded our house for three days. The flooding measured approximately two feet high and possibly deeper in other areas. My youngest child is three years old and he could potentially drown in our flooded street if he fell off the porch. It was impossible to drive down our street and made it very difficult to even take our children to school.

We support the passage of House Resolution 116.

My name is Acey Kohrogi and we own the house at 946 Wailupe place. We live in the mainland 75% of the time and live in our home on Wailupe the rest of the year. Though we were not in Hawaii at the time of the flood, we were able to see our home sumbmerged under water through the evening news and thoughtful neighbors. The entire property was flooded at the bottom level of the home. I had to make a special trip to Hawaii from the mainland to assess the damage. By the time I arrived most of the water had receeded but all of my belongings that were stored in that level of the home had been displaced and covered in mud and debris. I spent the next 4 days cleaning and organizing everything. Anything that was not water proof (vaccuum, power tools etc...) were damaged. This is probably the 3rd time this has happened since owning the property from 2004. This most recent flood was the worst one yet. We need immediate resolution for the drainage problem causing the back up during the rainy seasons especially because we do have many elderly and also young children living on our street who may not be capable of dealing with an even greater flood next time.
